Coursework involves aging studies, policy and management, but further incorporates a well-established commitment to health, wellness, business, technology and more. Students pursuing a degree are required to complete one or two internships before they graduate, and there are many internship partners to assist in their search. The overall benefit of this unique program is that it enables a strong foundation for future leaders to impact the field directly.
